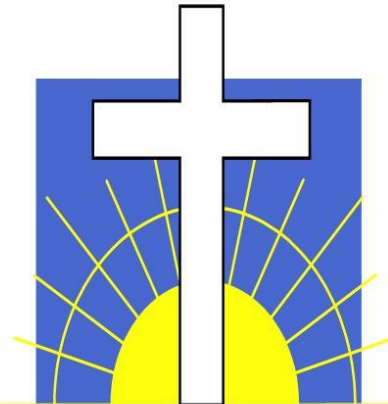

LENT

Lent is a season of forty weekdays and six Sundays, beginning on Ash Wednesday and culminating in Holy Week. During this season, the church in joy and sorrow, proclaims, remembers and responds to the atoning death of Christ. Two distinct periods at the end of Lent are: Holy Week (the week immediately preceding Easter, beginning with Passion/Palm Sunday) and the Three Days (the final three days comprising Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil).

During the season of Lent, we reflect on the ultimate sacrifice Christ made for us. It's a period of self denial, sacrifice, and spiritual cleansing and reflection. Join the members of First Baptist Church of South Orange as we empty out the dead things from our lives and seek God's face for an increase harvest of favor. This year we commit to "Living Our Faith—Generation to Generation" before the Lord. Join us as we all mind the things of God together.

LITURGY

Liturgical (liturgy—prescribed forms of or ritual for public worship) colors for the Easter Cycle are as follows:

First five weeks—purple

Passion/Palm Sunday—red and/or purple

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy-Week—Purple

Maundy Thursday—purple (until church is stripped bare). Good Friday and Saturday in Holy Week—no color since the church remained stripped bare.

EASTER

Easter is a fifth-day season of seven Sundays, beginning with the resurrection of the Lord Day (Easter Day), the festival of Christ's resurrection. Ascension Day, forty days after Easter, is celebrated to affirm that Christ is Lord of all times and places. The day of Pentecost marks the end of the Easter Season. *Liturgical color*: white and gold, except of the Day of Pentecost which is red.
